Vibrant flowers. Jagged rocks. Sun-bleached bones. As one of America's leading female artists, Georgia O'Keeffe captured the untouched beauty of some of nature's simplest subjects in her iconic still life paintings. With vivid colors and a distinct signature style, O'Keeffe's work became a cornerstone of 20th century American art.

Drawn to the quiet beauty, diverse culture and colorful landscapes of the American Southwest, O'Keeffe set out to New Mexico in 1917 in search of fresh inspiration. Fascinated by the region, she settled there permanently in 1949. Her Southwest-inspired paintings encouraged other artists to travel West, resulting in a dynamic regional art scene that still flourishes today.

Featuring more than 50 works from O'Keeffe and her contemporaries, *Georgia O'Keeffe and the Southwestern Still Life* tells the story of the Southwest as seen through the eyes of the artists it captivated.
