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Georgia O'Keeffe: Visions of the Sublime re-examines the work of one of the world's most iconic artists, most fitting for the Hunter's new building that will be an icon on Chattanooga's waterfront.

From her earliest works, Georgia O'Keeffe was a visionary who provided us with new ways to view our surroundings and explore our inner selves. This exhibition examines O'Keeffe's landscapes and how they fit with in the definition of the sublime: awe inspiring and investigating the infinite.

In its only southern appearance this show features approximately 35 paintings and works on paper by O'Keeffe, together with paintings by important American Artists such as Albert Bierstadt, Martin Johnson Heade, and George Inness from the Hunter's permanent collection. Also included are photographs by O'Keeffe's husband, Alfred Stieglitz, and noted American photographer Todd Webb.
